Historic Name: **Marine Corps Base Headquarters Building (Old)**
Date or Period: **ca. 1905**
Original Use: **Bank**
Vicinity: **Quantico**



This two-story building is constructed of stucco-over-brick on a stone foundation. It has a flat, tar-gravel roof. Stylistic features include a bracketed and lented molded cornice, bracketed pediments, and a molded, nine-pane overhead above the door. Built as a bank, this building has since housed a store, the Marine Corps Base bachelors' quarters, the base headquarters, and apartments for both military and civilian families.

Historic Name: **Quantico Masonic Lodge**
Date or Period: **ca. 1925**
Original Use: **Church**
Vicinity: **Quantico**

Originally built as a church, this one-and-a-half-story, brick structure now houses the Quantico Masonic Lodge. Sitting on a high, raised basement, the building has a slate-covered, gabled roof. Constructed on a cross-shaped plan, architectural features include stone lintels and sills, rounded arches over some windows, and translucent glass windows.
